Study Goals

Evaluate the infrastructure needs and priorities for a potential Rail Trail along a 13-mile section of the Beacon Line

- Task 1: Inventory and assess existing conditions DONE
- Task 2: Draft design concepts Trail concepts, Access & Trailhead Locations, Road Crossing Alternatives, Identification of Challenges, Trail Amenities
- Task 3: Final Concept Plan Cost Estimates, Phasing
 Recommendations, Funding Sources, and Recommendations



Progress to Date

- Metro-North rail banking
 - Surface Transportation Board (STB) decision (February 2024)
 - Progressing study with analysis of 'Rail to Trail' and 'Rail with Trail'
- Fieldwork completed (April 2024)
- Initial public outreach

 - Pop-up events Beacon & East Fishkill (May 2024)

Public Survey

We received over 1,350 responses to the online survey!

- 95% supported a rail trail on the study corridor
- Key considerations: connecting to destinations & neighborhoods, ensuring accessibility, and making it safe and secure
- Key amenities: restrooms, benches, waste receptacles, wayfinding signage
- Key uses: biking, walking, and connecting to other trails

Progress to Date (Cont'd)

• Traffic assessment

- 7 study intersections
- City of Beacon: Churchill St and E. Main St.

O Utility Coordination

- Central Hudson Gas & Electric Meeting (July 2024)
 - Reviewed crossing points; Feasibility of overhead electric relocations
 - Safety concerns at substation; Maintain access to system
- Con Edison Future meeting

Progress to date (Cont'd)

- Existing Conditions Report (October 2024)
 - Report posted on <u>Study Website</u>
 - <u>Majority of corridor is in good condition</u>
 - Manageable challenges; extensive opportunities for connectivity
- Presented trail concepts to Advisory Committee (December 2024)
 - Rail with Trail concept poses many challenges
 - Rail to Trail concept preferred; fewer overall impacts to the corridor

Trail Concepts - Comparison

Rail to Trail

- Re-use existing ballast stone & bridges
- Minimal impacts to environmental features like wetlands, floodplains, & established forests
- Remove railroad steel rails & wood ties
- Adaptive re-use of a transportation corridor
- Little to no ROW acquisitions required

Rail with Trail

- Railroad tracks/ties remain in place
- Trail offset from tracks 20-25 ft
- Significant construction costs due to new bridges, culvert extensions, & significant fill
- Extensive environmental impacts to wetlands, floodplains & tree clearing
- Physical constraints such as rock cuts, buildings, Fishkill Creek, roadways (Beacon)
- ROW acquisitions required

Existing Corridor Conditions



Overall Corridor

Physical characteristics, dimensions, ballast, drainage, road crossings, etc.



<u>Structures</u> Bridges & Overpasses



Natural Resources

Streams, wetlands, floodplains, historic & cultural resources, endangered species, equity, etc.

Overall Corridor

The railroad corridor was found to be in generally good condition.



Ballast: 75% in good or excellent condition



Drainage: 14 large culverts, 9 small culverts, 2 washouts



Access Points: 5 Parks, 4 informal access points



Utilities: Electric, communications, water, gas, sewer



Road Crossings: 7 major, 21 minor road/driveway

Natural Resources



Vegetation & Trees: No significant issues



Streams: 3 named & 3 unnamed watercourses



Wetlands: Fishkill & East Fishkill



Floodplains: 5 miles of corridor in some type of floodplain



Cultural Resources: Near historic areas and parks



Species: Indiana Bat, Bog Turtle, Monarch Butterfly
