From Points East:

- I-84W to Exit 13 (Route 9). Go North on Route 9. Marist College is located approx. 15 miles north on the left side of Route 9.

From Northern New York:

- Take the NY State Thruway to Exit 18 (New Paltz). Take Route 299 East to Route 9W South; continue on 9W to Route 44/55 (Mid-Hudson Bridge) Poughkeepsie. Make the first right off the bridge and immediately follow signs for Route 9 North, Hyde Park. Marist College is located approx. 1-1.5 miles north on the left side of Route 9.

From New York City:

- Take the Hutchinson River Parkway to I-684 North to I-84. Take I-84 West to Exit 13 (Route 9). Marist College is located approx. 15 miles north on the left side of Route 9.

From Long Island:

- From the Whitestone and Throgs Neck Bridges, take the Hutchinson River Parkway North to I-684; continue onto I-84 West to Exit 13 (Route 9 North). Marist College is located approx. 15 miles north on the left side of Route 9.

From Points West:

- Take I-84E to Exit 13 (Route 9). Go North on Route 9. Marist College is located approx. 15 miles north on the left side of Route 9.

CHRIS TRACZ



Chris Tracz is in his second season as the head coach at Marist College. In his first year he guided the Red Foxes to the second most wins in program history with 33 and finished second in the MAAC. Tracz returned to Marist after a year at West Point where the 2009 Black Knights reached the NCAA Tournament. Tracz helped the Red Foxes to three NCAA Tournament Appearances in 2001, 2002 and 2005 as a player. He is Marist's all time leader in strikeouts (298), wins (38) and innings pitched (379.1). During Tracz's playing career he was a Louisville Slugger and Baseball America Freshman All-American, as well as the 2001 MAAC Rookie of the Year, and the 2002 and 2005 MAAC Pitcher of the Year. Tracz spent his first three years as an assistant coach at Marist and was clinic director during that span.

JOE MICHALSKI



Joe Michalski is in his third season at Marist. A 2005 graduate of George Washington University, Michalski played professionally in the Baltimore Orioles' system for two years and spent the last two years as an assistant coach at University of Maryland-Baltimore County. At Marist, Michalski serves as recruiting coordinator and he will work with the Red Foxes' hitters and catchers. The 2010 offense improved its batting average by 25 points to .317, scored a school record 428 runs and struckout 127 less times, while stealing 44 more bases than a season prior. Following his collegiate career, Michalski spent two seasons with the Aberdeen IronBirds of the New York-Penn League, a short-season Class A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. There, he was managed by former longtime Orioles catcher Andy Etchebarren, who spent 15 years in MLB.

THOMAS SEAY



Thomas Seay is in his first season as assistant baseball coach at Marist. He most recently served as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Young Harris College. He also served as the team's catching and hitting instructor. Prior to his position at Young Harris, Seay was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Slippery Rock University for the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

There, he was the team's infield, catching and hitting instructor. Seay helped mentor catcher Matt Adams, who was named Division II Player of the Year and was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals. In 2006 and 2007, Seay was a volunteer assistant at Old Dominion University, where he worked with the team's outfielders and coached first base. The Monarchs were nationally ranked in 2006, and won the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season championship in 2007.
